## GIVING TIP

The holiday season is upon us and with it comes holiday shopping. Some of the most meaningful gifts can't be purchased in stores, though. Do you have someone on your gift list with a big heart? You know the kind I mean, someone who cares more about others than themselves and is 🧑 always supporting various causes.

Here's a twist on holiday gift-giving: donate something to their favorite charity in their honor. Instead of buying something short-lived that will break or spoil, you'll be making them a part of something lasting. (This is also an excellent way to honor a deceased loved one during the holidays.)

Most charities will allow you to make a gift in honor of someone else. At the alzheimers association® website ([www.alz.org](http://www.alz.org)), for example, click on the Donate link and then on Donate Online. The first question asked is whether this gift is a Memorial (to honor a deceased person), a Tribute (to honor a living person), or a general donation. If you don't know how to designate a donation to a particular charity as a memorial or tribute, contact the charity and ask.

Homeless shelters or soup kitchens could also use your help. In addition to financial resources, homeless shelters need food, clothing, and grooming items. With the oncoming cold winter season, the donation of warm coats and blankets is much appreciated. A coat or blanket can actually save the life of homeless person exposed to the elements. ## NOVEMBER RECIPE



Prep: 15 min., Broil: 15 min., Stand: 10 min., Cook: 7 min., Bake: 40 min.

Yield: Makes 8 servings

### Ingredients

- 4 poblano chile peppers
- 1 pound uncooked elbow macaroni
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups whipping cream
- 1 cup milk
- 3 cups (12 ounces) shredded Monterey Jack cheese, divided
- 1 (4-ounce) package goat cheese, crumbled
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup Italian-seasoned breadcrumbs
- 1/2 cup (2 ounces) shredded Parmesan cheese

### Preparation

Broil chile peppers on an aluminum foil-lined baking sheet 5 inches from heat about 5 minutes on each side or until chiles look blistered. Place chiles in a zip-top plastic bag; seal and let stand 10 minutes to loosen skins. Peel chiles; remove and discard seeds, and cut chiles into strips. Set aside.

Prepare macaroni according to package directions; drain and set aside. Melt butter in a Dutch oven over low heat; whisk in flour until smooth. Cook 1 minute, whisking constantly. Gradually whisk in cream and milk; cook over medium heat, whisking constantly, 5 minutes or until mixture is thickened and bubbly.

Stir in 2 3/4 cups Monterey Jack cheese, crumbled goat cheese, and salt until smooth. Stir in roasted chiles and macaroni. Spoon mixture into a lightly greased 13- x 9-inch baking dish. Top evenly with Italian-seasoned breadcrumbs and Parmesan cheese. Bake at 375° for 40 minutes. Remove from oven, and sprinkle evenly with remaining 1/4 cup Monterey Jack cheese. Broil 5 inches from heat about 3 to 5 minutes or until cheese is golden and bubbly.

## NOVEMBER IN HISTORY

**November 1, 1848** - The first medical school for women opened in Boston.

**November 2, 1947** - The first and only flight of Howard Hughes' "Spruce Goose" flying boat occurred in Long Beach Harbor, California. It flew about a mile at an altitude of 70 feet.

**November 3, 1957** - The Soviet Union launched the world's first inhabited space capsule, Sputnik II, which carried a dog named Laika.

**November 4, 1922** – Howard Carter discovered King Tut's tomb in Luxor, Egypt.

**November 4, 1979** - About 500 young Iranian militants stormed the U.S. Embassy in Teheran and took 90 hostages, including 52 Americans whom they held captive for 444 days.

**November 6, 1860** - Abraham Lincoln was elected as the 16th U.S. President and the first Republican. He received 180 of 303 possible electoral votes and 40 percent of the popular vote.

**November 7, 1944** - President Franklin D. Roosevelt was elected to an unprecedented fourth term, defeating Thomas E. Dewey.

**November 8, 1895** - X-rays (electromagnetic rays) were discovered by Wilhelm Roentgen at the University of Wuerzburg in Germany.

**November 9, 1872** - The Great Boston Fire started in a dry-goods warehouse then spread rapidly in windy weather, destroying nearly 800 buildings. Damage was estimated at more than \$75 million. The fire's bright red glare could be seen in the sky for nearly 100 miles.

**November 9, 1989** - The Berlin Wall was opened after standing for 28 years as a symbol of the Cold War. The 27.9 mile wall had been constructed in 1961.

**November 11, 1938** - Irving Berlin's *God Bless America* was first performed by Kate Smith.

**November 11, 1972** - The U.S. turned ended direct its military participation in the Vietnam War.

**November 13, 1956** - The U.S. Supreme Court ruled that racial segregation on public buses was unconstitutional.

**November 14, 1666** - The first experimental blood transfusion took place in England, utilizing two dogs.

**November 15, 1777** - The Articles of Confederation were adopted by Continental Congress.

**November 15, 1864** - General William T. Sherman burned Atlanta.

**November 17, 1558** - Queen Elizabeth I ascended the throne of England at the age of 25, reigning until 1603 when she was 69. Under her leadership, England became a world power.

**November 17, 1800** - The U.S. Congress met for the first time in the new capital at Washington, DC.

**November 18, 1883** - A Connecticut school teacher, Charles F. Dowd, proposed a uniform time zone plan for the U.S. consisting of four zones.

**November 19, 1863** - President Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg Address during ceremonies dedicating 17 acres of the Gettysburg Battlefield as a national cemetery.

**November 19, 1978** - The biggest mass suicide in history occurred as Reverend Jim Jones led over 900 followers to their deaths at Jonestown, Guyana.

**November 19, 1998** - The U.S. House of Representatives began an impeachment inquiry of President Bill Clinton

**November 20, 1945** - The Nuremberg War Crime Trials began.

**November 20, 1962** - The Cuban Missile Crisis concluded as President John F. Kennedy announced he had lifted the U.S. Naval blockade of Cuba stating, "the evidence to date indicates that all known offensive missile sites in Cuba have been dismantled."

**November 22, 1963** - At 12:30 p.m., on Elm Street in downtown Texas, President John F. Kennedy's motorcade slowly approached a triple underpass. Shots rang out. He was rushed to Parkland Memorial Hospital where fifteen doctors tried to save him. At 1 p.m., John Fitzgerald Kennedy, 35th President of the United States, was pronounced dead. On board Air Force One, at 2:38 p.m., Lyndon B. Johnson was sworn in as the 36th President.

**November 24, 1859** - Charles Darwin's book *On the Origin of Species by Means of Natural Selection* was first published, theorizing that all the living creatures descended from a common ancestor.

**November 26, 1789** - The first American holiday occurred, proclaimed by President George Washington to be Thanksgiving Day, a day of prayer and public thanksgiving in gratitude for the successful establishment of the new American democracy.

**November 30, 1782** - A provisional peace treaty was signed between Great Britain and the United States heralding the end of America's War of Independence.

**November 30, 1995** - Bill Clinton became the first American president to visit Northern Ireland.
